

- ? An unmarried Joseph F. Condro was our Pastor.
- ? Elder Charles Coburn and Rev. Condro were our Presbytery Commissioners.
- ? The South Asian Refugee family that we were helping to support with other churches arrived in the United States as permanent residents.

- ? There were six High School Graduates and three College Graduates. Each of them were congratulated at a Sunday service and honored with a church bouquet.
- ? A "Mother's Day" thank you was received from Adelphi's own Mother Verna Juska as we congratulated her on her voluntary service to the church these many years. Verna was bestowed as the "Mother" to our church on the past Mother's Day.


