At the March Session meeting

- --the Session elected Bettye Miller and Janet Dolen to the nominating committee for new elders and the PNC and tentatively scheduled a congregational meeting on April 26th;
- --received reports from the committees;
- --discussed what would need to be done to get the nursery functioning again; and
- --scheduled the Yard Sale for May 9th.

Our nominating committee is actively seeking persons to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). Since it is important that those asked to serve on the PNC be aware of the responsibility involved, the following is quoted from the presbytery's guidance for sessions and PNCs. For more complete information, go to <a href="www.nationalcapitalpresbytery.org">www.nationalcapitalpresbytery.org</a>. Then click on the following tabs: "Documents", "COM Policies and Procedures", Handbooks and sample documents", "PNC/Session Handbook. An overview of the process, adapted from that handbook, follows.

- ? The search process typically takes 12-24 months, with the PNC meeting weekly
- ? At the beginning of that time, and at least biweekly otherwise.
- ? The work involves preparing a Church Information Form, reviewing as many as 75-100 Personal Information Forms, interviewing candidates, hearing them preach, and checking references.
- ? There may be either local or out-of-town travel on weekends to hear candidates preach and interview them. [NOTE: Adelphi has typically invited candidates to travel to our area and preach locally in what is called "a neutral pulpit".]
- ? Members should be both actively involved in the life of the church and also able to assume this additional responsibility.
- ? The work of the committee must be kept absolutely confidential, even from family members. [NOTE: This can not be emphasized too strongly. The thing that is most disruptive to a successful search is information "leakage" from the PNC.]
- ? Members must be willing to work towards consensus, putting the best interests of the congregation over personal interests.
- ? Members should understand that they will be involved in a calling process whereby the PNC seeks to discern God's call for new leadership in the church, rather than simply a hiring process.

This is a very brief overview of the process and if you are contacted, please pray and look deeply into your heart to decide if you want to be a part of the process. Also, if finding the best Pastor for Adelphi is something you feel strongly about or want more information, please contact either Janet Dolen, Bettye Miller, Martin Ojong, or Tad Jembere or Rev. Doty. Volunteers are welcome.

If you are an Elder who can attend any of these meetings, please let Janet Dolen or Pastor Doty know so we can have full representation at all meetings.

# \*\*\* OUTCOMES OF "YES" – YOUTH EMPHASIS SUNDAY

\*For now, the Sunday School for younger elementary children will continue each Sunday right after Time With Children in the worship service (approx. 11:25-12:00).

\*Starting on March 1, a new class for Juniors (older elementary students and teens) began at 10:00 a.m. on Sundays.

\*The Nursery has been renovated, thanks to Priscilla and Hudson Lancaster and others, so that babies and toddlers will have a warm, friendly, safe, comfortable place to be while their parents are in worship; volunteers were sought to serve in the Nursery, although we foresee hiring an individual on a more permanent basis. (Two more volunteers would be welcome.)

\*Rev. Karen Doty spoke about the plans for a Youth Group, targeted primarily for the Junior youth students, which would meet twice a month for service projects and social activities. She also introduced Ms. Cheryl Holder, who lives nearby and is eager to work with our youth in various activities centering on camping and the arts. Included in the Youth Group activities will be preparation for confirmation for those who are eligible, with actual confirmation planned for May. We hope to see dates for those meetings very soon.

\*Not leaving out the adults, we established an adult education class to be taught by Rev. Doty on Sunday mornings from 10:00-10:45, coinciding with the new Junior Youth class. We hope that the Nursery volunteers will be on hand at that time as well for the infants, toddlers, and younger children. In this way, everyone will have opportunities for Christian Education every Sunday.

So, come one, come all and be part of the Adelphi Renaissance in Christian Education. Everyone has something to give, and we have much to share with one another. Say "YES" to "Youth Emphasis Service" and to satisfying our hunger for knowing God.
