Awakening Teen Camp

Between the 14th and the 29th of June I was in Kansas City, Missouri for Awakening Teen Camp. Awakening Teen Camp (ATC) is a Bible camp of teens age 13-18 and I would strongly recommend it.

We were able to stay in a hotel about a mile from our main meeting place for worship. ATC had floors 3-7 which was every floor except 2, which we deemed the "crazy floor". We would start the day with breakfast, which was from 7-8. Most of us went down in pajamas being the lazy teens we were. Afterwards we went to FSM, short for Forerunner School of Ministry. Inside there was a huge room that seated 2,000 people so there was plenty of room for the 300 of us. We would worship from 8:30 to about 11 depending on the speaker Afterwards we had lunch and then intensives. Intensives were classes, which we picked in the beginning of camp. Classes such as Prophetic, Evangelism, or End Times to name a few. Afterwards we had dinner and went back to FSM for worship. We didn't get back to the hotel until 10 or 11. Lights out was midnight.

I liked hearing the testimonies of the many speakers and how God worked in their lives. Almost all of the speakers had a way of keeping us awake because by week two we got sleepy easily. One man made us shout about every half hour and I think that was successful

We had a lot of fun between worship and intensives. For example, one Sunday night the counselors started a pillow fight. I was on floor 6 and floor 7 is a guy's floor so girls weren't allowed. Well, from floor six we could literally hear the sound of pillows hitting each other. I got to see a counselor covered in shaving cream. I later found out that it was the teen boys who had done that. This lasted till midnight and everyone talked about it the next day. And almost every night at FSM during announcements the director of ATC, Brent Steeno, or other counselors would have a new rule for us because someone would do something teen-like or in other words crazy and meaningless. There was a man named Zach who would tell us funny stories when we had to wait for shuttle transportation to the hotel from FSM. There was also a funny shuttle driver named Tony who

would sing really horribly in crazy accents.

All in all it was a fun and spiritually fulfilling experience and I can't wait till next year to go again.


