(Even) The Church Must Change by Jan Edmiston National Capital Presbytery Newsletter

This is written in honor of longtime volunteer and elder "ETC" – one of my favorite people -- whose life has changed. She recently left our congregation and community in Northern Virginia to move to a retirement community near her daughter after turning 90 last summer. She's been a part of our congregation for so long that she's witnessed ... - the coming and going of numerous pastors and associate pastors

- the change from the congregation that needed multiple pastors to a solo pastor church

- the creation, closing, re-opening, and re-closing of our preschool

the shrinking of our Presbyterian Women Circles the ordination of women elders, deacons, and

ministers of the Word and sacrament

- the evolution of our office equipment from a Smith Corona manual typewriter to an IBM Selectric to a Canon digital copier that also scans, faxes, emails, and digitizes

- the shift from a congregation filled to the rafters with well-dressed young families to a smaller congregation made up of similar young families along with immigrant members, interracial couples, gay men and women, homeless worshippers, and

lots of single people – who may or may not be "well-dressed."

ETC once commented to me that it was disconcerting to watch the world changing so

rapidly. She tried to keep up though, getting a home computer and learning how to send email. She even learned how to use the digital copier in the volunteer office. But she said that, with all the world changing, she counted on the church to be the

one thing that would never change. She wanted to sing familiar hymns on Sunday mornings. She wanted the order of worship to be recognizable. She wanted to see familiar faces in the pews. Therein lays the challenge. We who love the church need to ask ourselves what we love about it.

- Do we love that it serves our personal needs and satisfies our private tastes?

- Or do we love the church because it is transforming our community? Because it is giving the people in our neighborhood a glimpse of heaven on earth? Because it is saving the lives of people who are sorely in need of a Savior? "For I the Lord does not change" (Malachi 3:6, NRSV). Times change. People change. Things change. Even the church must change. Only God never changes. And if we want the church we love to thrive, we need to let go of the things we don't want to change. Even at the age of 90, my friend has been willing to embrace this truth.

WORSHIP AT HILLHAVEN by Larry and Kathie James

As many of you already know, we have been privileged to conduct worship services for the residents of Hillhaven Nursing and Rehabilitation Center on the first Sunday of every month at

10:30 a.m. Three of those residents are or have been members of our church—Dr. and Mrs. David Beard and Ms. Lynn Mears. We follow an Order of Service that is modeled after Adelphi's worship, tailored especially for persons who are in wheelchairs, who may be hard of hearing, who may not be able to see well or at all, and those recuperating from accidents or illnesses, as well as fairly able-bodied senior citizens. Staff members often attend, and sometimes visiting family members join us as well, such as Joan Romig, when she is in town. We include a Prelude, a Call to Worship, several familiar hymns that are printed in large type, three short segments of Scripture followed by "Words of Sharing" about the passages, morning prayers, a Benediction, and a Postlude. We always prepare bulletins so that the "congregation" may have something to read and remember afterwards. The attendance varies from about 10 to almost 30, usually filling the parlor area. Following the 30- to 45-minute service, we enjoy visiting briefly with the people before we return promptly to Adelphi to join our service in progress.

Peace Notes – Things to Pray For --

The true meaning of Christmas – celebrating the birth of Christ -- sometimes gets lost in all of the excitement of gifting and joyful sharing. As we come together as families and friends this holiday season, let us pray that the loving, peaceful spirit of Christ lives within us and that we may be loving, patient and peaceful with others and ourselves, as Christ was.


