At the December session meeting, the Elders approved the communion schedule for 2007, scheduled a retreat for January 22, and also scheduled the congregational meeting for the last Sunday in January.

Rev. Ann Philbrick will come in February to conduct a worship service with the congregation.

The session went over the preliminary budget for 2007. The Elders discussed ways to get pledges in to finalize the budget and areas that may need to be increased (added money for a financial audit). The issue of the Pastor's salary was also discussed. The Pastor's salary will have to be substantially increased and the Session was presented with a schedule for increasing the Pastor's salary to the Presbytery's standards. The Session discussed the level of commitment needed by Adelphi's members and options for handling this increase. The budget would be reworked to take this issue into account.

than usual to be a part of this occasion. You gave a lovely gift to the Hillhaven folks, and we may have started a tradition!




RETURN TO HILLHAVEN
