## Urban Missionaries Tadele Jembere

The cover of the January 25 2009 issue of the Washington Post Magazine drew my attention with images of faith strewn over the front page. At the bottom of the page there is a picture of mother Teresa, her frail image belying her monumental faith and iron will.

The central character is Laura Cartagena, a twenty five year old graduate of Catholic University who founded A Simple House, a Catholic lay ministry to the urban poor of Southeast Washington DC a year and a half ago. Abandoning a life of comfort in suburbia, she moved into a donated rowhouse that came with Lucy, a homeless schizophrenic who had to live in the house as a condition of donation, a year and a half ago. The ministry has attracted four more college graduates who had all bought into the concept of urban mission and who had all vowed a life of "Poverty, Obedience, and Chastity", principles underlying the concept of A Simple House. They have no air conditioning, no television, no internet. How refreshing! The cars they use in the ministry, their cell phones are all donated. Laura earns 200 dollars a month to serve two dozen families in Southeast Washington. She and her roommates have put their lives at risk in the maelstorm of drugs, turf violence, teen pregnancy in Southeast DC.

They fight losing their faith in God watching daily recalcitrant lives of people who are not only poor in a material sense but are devoid of hope and love. They have gone past the popular, What Would Jesus Do? question to the next phase: How would Jesus Live?. The writer of the book <a href="Irresistible Revolution:Living">Irresistible Revolution:Living</a> <a href="As An Ordinary Radical">As An Ordinary Radical</a>, Shane Clairborne is quoted in the article as saying "People are not crucified for helping the poor. People are crucified for joining them".

For a church our size we have a good mission and evangelism project. I recall our former pastor, Eunice Yang, telling us in one of our retreats writing a check is not mission. If we can serve the poor in one of many soup kitchens we would be blessed in that it would help us appreciate our relative comfort and allow us to grow spiritually.

A post script - Laura had a grandmother who read bible stories for her in an illustrated children's bible while she was growing up, a grandmother who she says is "A pillar of Sanctity and Virtue." . Having just volunteered to do a Sunday a month with our teens at the encouragement of Kathie James, not knowing whether I can do a good job, I will hold that pillar in mind as the seed in Laura's committing her life to God.


