# **MEANING OF MEMBERSHIP IN The Presbyterian Church (USA)**

The incarnation of God in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ gives to the church not only its mission but also its understanding of membership. One becomes an active member of the church through faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and acceptance of his Lordship in all of life. Baptism and a public profession of faith in Jesus as Lord are the visible signs of entrance into the active membership of the church.

Persons may enter into active church membership in the following ways: by profession of faith, reaffirmation of faith in Jesus Christ, or transfer of certificate from some other church.

A faithful member accepts Christ's call to be involved responsibly in the ministry of his church. Such involvement includes:

- Proclaiming the good news,
- Taking part in the common life and worship of a particular church,
- Praying and studying Scripture and the faith of the Christian Church,
- Supporting the work of the church through the giving of money, time, and talents,
- Participating in the governing responsibilities of the church,
- Demonstrating a new quality of life within and through the church,
- Responding to God's activity in the world through service to others,
- Living responsibly in the personal, family, vocational, political, cultural, and social relationships of life.
- Working in the world for peace, justice, freedom, and human fulfillment.

#### God Speaks to Us at Tax Time—Really!

On April 15—the traditional day for filing our income taxes—Bible Breakfast Club met, with 6 children and 7 adults present. After singing and praying, we learned about Priscilla, a Jewish woman who became a Christian and evangelized many people in Corinth. We then studied about Matthew, also a Jew and one of

Jesus's Apostles, who was a tax collector. In Bible times, tax collectors were usually dishonest and were hated by the public, so people wanted to know why Jesus chose Matthew and why Matthew hosted a big dinner party for Jesus and other tax collectors. Jesus replied that He had come to minister to the sick and the sinners, not the righteous people. Then, we learned about tithing by reading Malachi 3:8-12, which was found on page 1040 of the Good News Bible! (Taxes can be good news!) Ask the children how much a person should give to God after receiving \$10 or \$100 or \$1,000,000, in order to give a tithe, or 10%. Each child received a piggy bank with the verse II Cor. 9:7c (God loves a cheerful giver) on the side; and each child received ten pennies, one to put into the bank as a tithe and nine to keep.
