#### CALM FOLLOWING THE STORM

To the members and friends of Adelphi,

If you were in church last Sunday, you will recall that I likened Jesus' re-appearing to the disciples, to experiencing the calm after a tornado. A tornado disrupts one's life. Major experiences happen in life that simulate the tornado experience. They are the events that take our breath away and can leave us panicked if we are not grounded. Now it is not my habit to chase tornadoes, but I have happened across them several times in the Midwest and once in southern Maryland. I have also had tornado-like experiences such as the death of my late husband 5 years ago. I also shared that the latest tornado in my life is breast cancer. And I shared that I was grounded in Christ.

Now I am in the calm following the storm. I was fortunate enough to be scheduled into surgery Tuesday, the day after my appointment with my surgeon since another patient had cancelled. The surgeon predicted that, though the tumor was at the bounds of Stage 1 in

size, it would be relatively easy to treat. Now I am happy to report that the tumor has been removed, and pathology has affirmed the cancer to be Stage 1 with no cancer cells in the lymph nodes or surrounding tissue. There will be follow-up treatment to assure that any stray cells that may have been missed are dealt with. That treatment pales in comparison with what might have been, and what some of you have experienced.

It has been an amazing and miraculous journey, and I thank you for your prayers and support.

May the peace of Christ be with you in your own journeys, and especially in your life's "tornado" experiences.
