TRANSFORMATION

I want to share with you a short story about a wonderful thing that has happened. My own transformation during the last few months. When I was asked to be a member of the Transforming Congregations Project, I said yes without much contemplation. I guess that was good, because if I had gotten the chance to ask more questions and find out what the project entailed, I would have probably turned down the request. When I learned more about the project, I immediately knew what I was going to do. I was going to go out like the army, and recruit more members, help put together more church programs, and our church transformation would be complete.

I have since learned that it is more than filling the pews, and creating new programs. I learned that transformation is about me and my relationship with God.

For the past seven months, I have learned to ask God to lead me. I start each day with a prayer, and end each day with reading the Bible, and a prayer. My ritual is to

kneel beside my bed, and pray out loud. I praise the Lord for all his goodness, and all his blessings. I ask God to watch over me, and help me to do God's will. Of course I don't forget to also ask God for those selfish blessings of finances, and a good husband, etc. etc. After all didn't God say "Ask and it will be given unto you? Knock and the door will be opened? Seek, and ye shall find?" Then I always end with thanksgiving for I know my prayers have already been answered.

This new way of life has led me closer to God, I see God in everything around me. I see God in the flowers, in animals, in people...even those that offend me; I try to ask God to bless them. Friends I have to tell you that my transformation is already on the way. I sing along loudly in my car to Christian music, and I always feel happy and content even when things are not going so well. I even find myself talking about God to family and friends whenever and where ever. There's no one shyer than I am, but sometimes during conversations about faith I interject brilliant arguments that I know for sure are not coming from me. I just smile and give God the glory.

A few months ago we tried to put together prayer groups, not only to pray for our church, and each other, but to get to really know each other as the multi-cultural church that we "are". Not one of the groups has yet gotten together. We all have things to do, and places to go, but when Pastor Yang told me that all we needed to jump start our transformation is prayer...my reply to her was "We can't even get ourselves together to pray, how are we then to start?"

Dear friends, if transformation starts with each and every one of us, what are we doing to transform ourselves, or more accurately put, to be transformed by God in Jesus Christ? Transformation in my opinion is showing up with a full cup in order to share with those whose cups are empty. If our mission from Jesus Christ is to go out into the world and make disciples, how do we give when our cups are empty?

I believe that if each one of us through constant Bible study, prayer, and meditation is filled with the Holy Spirit, we will not have to worry about filling the pews. I remember Reverend Ann Philbrick saying to us at one of our TCP meetings..."We Presbyterians are not comfortable with sharing our faith". If we grow closer to God, and are filled with joy, we would want to testify about the goodness of God in our lives. People will come to our church to find out for themselves how they can also be transformed and how they can experience God working in their lives. I recently heard the host of a Christian radio program say that being a Christian is not about receiving, but instead about service. Service to the community, service to the church, and service to God.

To jump start our transformation, Pastor Eunice Yang will be leading a one-month Wednesday night Bible study and prayer. We will also have fun, share our joys and concerns, and get to know one another much better. We are asking every one to commit to just one month, that is just four Wednesday nights in September from 7:00pm to 8:00pm.

What a wonderful VBS we had this summer! Every evening from July 18-22 at 6:00-8:00PM, we gathered for a light dinner, interesting classes, and a brief worship service. The planning committee had hoped for at least five people in each three classes, but we were blessed with more than double that number on one occasion. There was between 18 to 31 people present, 13 adults came and 18 children,

17 were affiliated with our church and 14 were from other churches and neighborhoods. A few came from our immediate neighborhood, but others came from a greater distance. One person came from Damascus to join us. Our meals started with soup and salad, we did not know how many to expect; but similar to the story of the loaves and fishes, our food was multiplied by donations from Adelphi members and friends. Every night we had food left over.

The adult class, led by Rev. Yang, focused on the contemporary family using "Transforming Family" – a document approved by General Assembly as the basis for some lively discussions! The children's classes, led by Elders Bettye Miller and Kathie James, featured Bible stories, songs, and crafts each evening. On the last night, the youth groups shared some of the lessons they learned with the adults; referring to some issues they discussed and answering some pointed questions. The young people sang songs and showed their crafts, representing Creation, Jonah, Daniel, and Jesus. All participants received a certificate and an ice cream party was held after worship.

We want to thank everyone for yours prayers, ("The prayer of a righteous [person] has greater power in its effects."—James 5; 16a), the food that was sent, your attendance, your bringing others, your participation in many ways, and your support. We especially thank Candace Philander coordinator, and Evelyn Jones, chef! Let's do it again next year!



The Bible Breakfast Club met on August 21 at 9:30am. Thanks to Michele Thurber and Charlotte Ojong, we enjoyed a delicious breakfast as we shared prayers together, sang Bible songs, studied Bible verses, and heard Bible stories. We learned about Elijah and Elisha, young King Josiah, and Jesus' first miracle. A common theme was the jars which were transformed. Both Elijah and Elisha

ministered to poor women who had jars of oil what were running out; but in both cases, these prophets prayed to God, Who allowed the jars not to run out; but to give all the oil that was needed. When Jesus attended a wedding in Cana, the jars of wine ran out; but He told his disciples to fill jars with water, which they did, and Jesus turned the water into wine for the wedding guest. Each young person at the breakfast Club received a small jars with a cross on top, with a label that quoted Scripture verse about the jar that did not run dry. Our jars contain a liquid for blowing bubbles, and we know we can refill them in order to continue blowing bubbles: but the cross reminds us of God's miracles and how H e cares for us. The next meeting of the Bible Breakfast Club is Sunday, September 18, at 9:30am.

Families and Friends of ages are welcome and invited to attend. Please come!

In October, we will have Sunday School every Sunday at 9:30 a.m. We would like to initiate a Christian Education program for our children that has more continuity and more opportunity for kids to come and learn about Bible history and the teachings of Jesus. Lessons will consist of songs, prayers, Bible verses, Bible stories, and related activities. Children of all ages are invited. Rev. Yang will conduct an adult class at the same time for parents who wish to attend. These dual classes will meet on October 2, 9, 23, and 31 with October 16 as our Bible Breakfast Club Sunday (breakfast is available, and the lesson is intergenerational, with everybody together). We will evaluate the October Sunday School toward the end of that month and ask for your opinions and suggestions.
